Google Certificate Install

Instructions for Android

To use Google search or any of the Google apps on your device you need to download and install the Google Certificate.

These steps are **only required for personal devices** and not school owned devices.

1. In Chrome, Edge or Firefox, go to https://cert.cranleigh.org (or scan the QR code).







2. Download "contentkeeper-ca-2-Base64.cer"



3. If it opens to either of the two pages below, Just ignore them and press back or the home button. The box lacks the option we need and can only be done in settings app



4. In settings, Go to "Security"
